

Christian Prejudice Could You Be Prejudice?

So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of My mouth. Because you say, ‘I am rich [spiritually], have become wealthy [I know about God], and have need of nothing [I don’t require any more knowledge about God or His plan]’—and do not know that you are wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked—I counsel you to buy from Me gold refined in the fire, that you may be rich; and white garments, that you may be clothed, *that* the shame of your nakedness may not be revealed; and anoint your eyes with eye salve, that you may see. As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten. Therefore be zealous and repent” (Rev. 3:15-19 NKJV).

Jesus is saying because so many have refused the opportunity to join the Father in His work and have rejected the advanced knowledge of His plans for mankind they are going to have to have their beliefs tested and refined during the great tribulation. Many are in a wretched state, spiritually speaking; they don’t understand much about the details of their faith. And being in such a miserable position, they do what seems right in their own eyes, not realizing they are bankrupt spiritually. They have blinded their own minds with sin that they are allowing in their lives; therefore, they are unable to see additional TRUTHS from JESUS.

Many believers are marginal Christians. They live in a paradigm of their own design saying they are Christians but their lives belie that fact. A little knowledge of Jesus is enough for them. If they were to learn more about God, the new information would condemn their wicked lives. So they have come to a truce with God, “You can be out on the front porch of my life. Be there if I need you, but don’t try to come inside. So Jesus Christ is standing outside the lives of many believers today saying, “Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear My voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with Me” (Rev. 3:20). When are we going to allow Jesus to come in and clean up our hearts and minds, filled with Spiritual pride and vanity, and allow Him to give us the tasty spiritual food He has prepared for us?

Jesus says to these “believers,” “But why do you call Me ‘Lord, Lord,’ and not do the things which I say?” (Luke 6:46 NKJV).

Many like quasi-truths that leave them room to establish their own standards of morality and truth. That way they will not be exposed for the hypocrites they really are.

Jesus said, “**For everyone practicing evil hates the light** and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed. But **he who does the truth comes to the light**, that his deeds may be clearly seen, that they have been done in God” (John 3:20-21 NKJV).
